







## FABRIC REQUIREMENTS\*

	BABY 40" x 45"	THROW 56" x 60"
 A	¼ yard	¼ yard
 B	¼ yard	¼ yard
 C	¼ yard	¼ yard
 D	¼ yard	¼ yard
 E	1½ yards	2⅛ yards
Backing**	2⅔ yards	3½ yards
Binding	⅜ yard	½ yard

\* Solids and non-directional prints work best with this pattern.

\*\* Allows for 4" overage on all sides and assumes fabrics are non-directional

- Width of Fabric (WOF) is assumed to be 43"

- RST = right sides together
- All seam allowances are ¼" unless otherwise stated

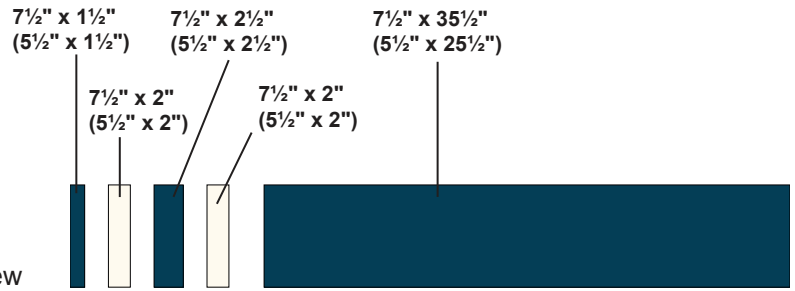
## STRIPE UNIT ASSEMBLY

**Note:** All instructions and diagrams will be for the throw size (baby size).

1. Lay out alternating Color A and Color E pieces in the order shown in **Fig. 1**

2. With RST and **using a scant quarter inch seam**, sew pieces to form a row. Press each seam toward the darker fabric as you go. Stripe unit should measure  $42\frac{1}{2}" \times 7\frac{1}{2}"$  ( $31\frac{1}{2}" \times 5\frac{1}{2}"$ ). **Fig. 2**

3. Repeat steps 1-2 for B+E, C+E, and D+E stripe units.



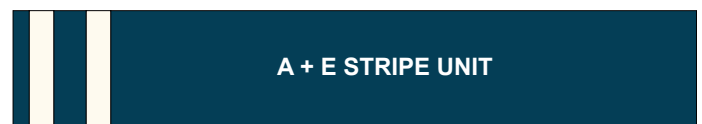

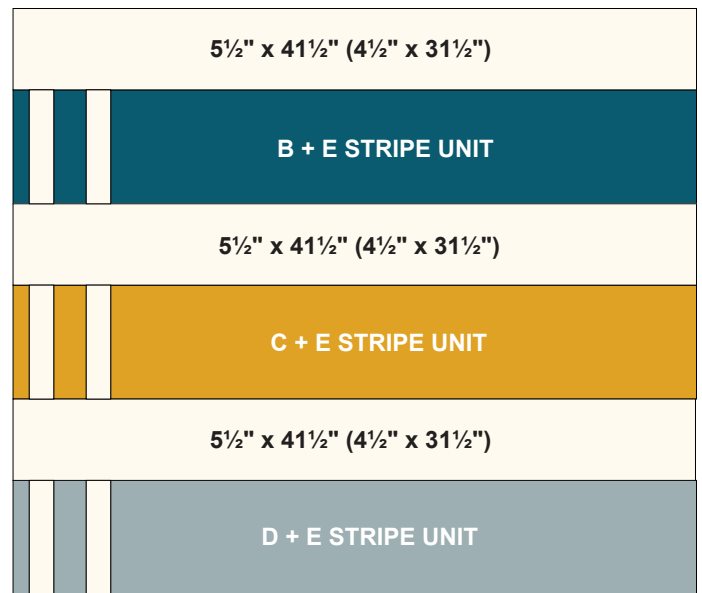

## QUILT ASSEMBLY

1. Lay out pieces to be sewn together. Pin and sew pieces RST pressing seams toward darker strips as you go. **Fig. 3**

## BORDER ASSEMBLY

1. Measure the top and bottom of the quilt top. Cut (2) Color E 9" x WOF (7" x WOF) border strips to the average height of the quilt top, approximately  $9" \times 41\frac{1}{2}"$  ( $7" \times 31\frac{1}{2}"$ ).

2. With RST, pin and sew the border strips to the sides of the quilt top. Press the seams away from the quilt top. **Fig. 4**

3. Sew the (4) Color E 8" x WOF [(3) 5" x WOF] strips together into one long border strip. To make stronger seams, line up the strips at a  $90^\circ$  angle, RST. Sew a diagonal seam from corner to corner. Trim the fabric  $\frac{1}{4}"$  from the seam and press open. **Fig. 5**

4. Measure the two vertical sides of the quilt top. Cut (2) border strips to the average height of the quilt top, approximately  $8" \times 60\frac{1}{2}"$  ( $5" \times 45\frac{1}{2}"$ ).

5. With RST, pin and sew the border strips to the sides of the quilt top. Press the seams away from the quilt top. **Fig. 6**

\* To ensure seams are a scant  $\frac{1}{4}"$  before starting this block, sew (3)  $2\frac{1}{2}"$  wide scrap strips together using a scant  $\frac{1}{4}"$  seam allowance, pressing seams to one side as you go. Once all three strips are sewn together and pressed, use a small ruler to measure strip width. The middle strip should measure exactly 2" wide, while the outer strips should be  $2\frac{1}{4}"$  wide. If measurements are off, adjust seam allowance and repeat until measurements come out correctly.



## FINISH THE QUILT

1. Make a quilt sandwich: backing wrong side up, batting, and quilt top right side up.
2. Baste quilt using desired method.
3. Quilt using desired method.
4. Prepare binding and bind quilt as desired.

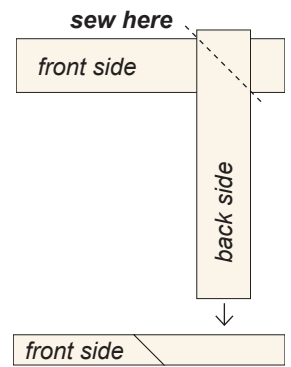
